Use the following questions to guide discussions with potential support groups that you are interested in in order to better prepare the individual with ASD and their supporting team to choose a group and work collaboratively with them to ensure long-term success.

<p>5. What types of topics are discussed?</p>	
<p>6. Is everyone that attends this group from this area? Are there any specifications on who can attend this support group?</p>	
<p>7. How many people typically attend this group?</p>	
<p>8. Is this a formal or informal group? Is there a structured routine or is it more conversational?</p>	
<p>9. Will I get to network with other parents?</p>	
<p>10. Is there someone to help me (before or after the group) if I have questions?</p>	

<p>11. Do you provide childcare? If so, is there a cost? What does childcare look like? Is the childcare staff trained to work with individuals with autism?</p>
